Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting Argyle Country Club Sept. 16, 1993

President Dick Bevan called the meeting to order at 9:50 AM. Dick thanked Tom McNamara and the Argyle Country Club for hosting the meeting.

The minutes of the meeting held at Hunt Valley C C on July 13, 1993 were approved as mailed to each member of the board.

Doug Moats introduced Chuck Cissel, also a member of the Montgomery CC as the newly appointed secretary for the year 1994.

Treasurers Report - Harry Breitbach

A financial statement dated Sept. 30, 1993 was presented. The Events revenue showed an excellent increase over 1992. Printing and mailing costs proved to be the greatest expense increases. A discussion followed regarding the economies and awareness that can be made on these two items in 1994.

The proposed budget for 1994 was submitted and discussed. The figures were predicated on having one (1) additional club. The Events revenue was downgraded to \$1000. The expense for trophies was increased to \$400. The proposed budget was accepted after the modifications.

Associates - Roy Gauzza

Brooke Manor will be dropped as a member effective 9/25/93. Roy again asked for continual updating of club rosters and forwarded to him.

Audit - Ed Abel

Ed is retiring as our auditor. See "New Business" for additional info.

Mailing - Ralph Laycock

Ralph reported that Florida Fling mailing would be made when arrangements were final. Economies in the mailing will be effected.

Planning - Ted Branthover

Ted showed samples of the MISGA golf shirts that will be available in different colors. The cost will be \$18.95 plus \$5.00/logo. More to come on this in the future.

Past Presidents Tournament - George Lipscomb

George reported on comments made directly to the Rolling Road CC Pro by individuals. It was agreed that this is in bad taste. All comments should be made through the club rep and the tournament director. A letter of apology will be forwarded to the Rolling Road club pro.

It was suggested that all clubs that feed prior to a tournament use the double line system to expedite feeding, especially when serving buffet style.

A discussion followed regarding the handicap system in 2-man tournaments. It was moved and passed that entries should have one man with a handicap under 18 and his playing partner be greater than 18.

Historian - Ray Keany -

Ray gave an outline of the proposed history to include a 20 year history and the use of an earlier report. It was suggested that this be distributed by the division directors and representatives once it is published.

1993 awards will remain as in the past. Awards in 1994 will be the first under the new format. The new administration will appoint a committee to implement the new process.
