MEETING NOTES

OPENING REMARKS – JEFF HILD

- 1. Jake's Story Jake is home from the hospital, he had surgery on January 31 and is recovering from home. He is feeling a whole lot better and his doctor has assured him that he will be able to play golf sometime this year. He is still doing his website duties, so if you have anything for the website, send it along to him.
- 2. Cost Savings Proposal to Save on the Website Jake and Tom Rowlett will be working on it. Tom Rowlett's package that he uses for the signup system has a capability to host a robust website. If we migrate things to Tom's host, we can systematically renovate the current website. Savings would occur with this consolidation.
- 3. Make sure all of the MISGA Website information is up to date.
- 4. Go over the remaining Events for 2020 March 31 for the club representatives meeting @ Prospect Bay, September meeting is still not scheduled (no Liberty Mountain), December 16 (tentative) @ Crofton. The Manor XMAS party will be on December 8.
- 5. Wayne Rowland sent an email on club handicap system compliance with the World Handicap System. It seems that all of the club handicap systems are in compliance except Bay Hills who is working on the problem.
- 6. The USGA and The R&A have issued the Distance Insights Report, which provides comprehensive research and analysis on the contributors to, and long-term impacts of, hitting distance in golf.

After extensive stakeholder research, the report features more than 100 years of data. It is accompanied by a 15-page conclusions paper from the governing bodies that summarizes their perspectives on the long-term implications for the sport.

The reports and library have been publicly released and can be found at <u>usga.org/distanceinsights</u>.

Key findings of the project include:

- There is a 100-year trend of hitting distance increases in golf, as well as a corresponding increase in the length of golf courses, across the game globally **The USGA and The R&A** believe this continuing cycle is detrimental to the game's long-term future.
- The inherent strategic challenge presented by many golf courses can be compromised, especially when those courses have not or cannot become long enough to keep up with

increases in the hitting distances of the golfers who play from their longest tees. This can lead to a risk of many courses becoming less challenging, or obsolete.

- Increased hitting distance can begin to undermine the core principle that the challenge of golf is about needing to demonstrate a broad range of skills to be successful.
- If courses continue to lengthen, it is at odds with growing societal concerns about the use of water, chemicals, and other resources
- Longer distances and courses, longer tees and longer times to play are taking golf in the wrong direction and are not necessary for a challenging, enjoyable and sustainable game.
- A concern has been identified that many recreational golfers are playing from longer tees
 than is necessary relative to their hitting distances, and, in particular that the forward tees
 on many golf courses are very long for many of the golfers who play from them.

No solutions have been determined as yet. The USGA and The R&A will now enter the next phase of their work by assessing potential solutions that can help end the cycle of increased distance.

VICE PRESIDENT REMARKS – WAYNE ROWLAND

Wayne will send all of the division directors and assistants a form simplifying the MISGA club dues and associates dues process. In a future meeting, we may discuss the elimination of the Associates Chair.

RULES & HANDICAP – WAYNE ROWLAND

- 1. Continuing discussion on World Handicap System. For more detail, check with the USGA website for frequently asked questions.
- 2. Wayne pointed out prior to 2020, the USGA Handicap System was described as the information and instruction of the system. For 2020, the World Handicap System is Referred to as "The Rules of Handicapping."
- 3. Wayne has been involved with the USGA in the refinement of the current rules.
- 4. Everyone should get a copy of new Handicap Rules. See the USGA website.
- 5. The basis for calculating the Playing Conditions Calculation is now par plus your handicap is your expected score.

- 6. USGA places a lot more emphasis on the club handicap committees. Handicap Committees should conduct a review of every players' handicap index annually. A handicap committee may be conducted at the request of the player or another player at any time.
- 7. The Rules of Handicapping now describes the concept of the "most likely score."

TOURNAMENTS – GREG MORRIS

- 1. Dates and announcements are on the MISGA website.
- 2. Discussion about what to do with handicaps for the state events now that the World Handicap System rules have raised the maximum handicap to 54.0. The committee for the event can still set the limit for maximum handicaps at 36.0 as long as they convey that information to all of the entrants before the event.
- 3. Wayne will write an article to lay out the new handicap system.
- 4. Stim and Greg Morris will have the handicap calculation methodology for the state tournaments printed in the announcements for the tournaments.
- 5. State tournaments will start earlier in the day to get people out earlier. Also, food will be cut back and the entry fees will be reduced.


NEW BUSINESS

Recommendations:

- Recommend adding a link to the MISGA Home Page to promote and support as required Tom Rowlett's Sign-Up system. Jake will work with Tom Rowlett and others to post the appropriate documents and links.
- Recommend working with Tom Rowlett to determine if MISGA can reduce its annual web expenses by combining the two Internet Hosting accounts (1) MISGA.ORG and (2) the MISGA-SignUp.ORG in to one account.
- This is a suggestion to clubs that use Tom Rowlett's signup system: Add a link near the
 top of their club web page so a user can access their club's signup system from their
 MISGA club page.

Security:

The MISGA web site is subjected to a security scan on a weekly basis. No security issues were detected.
