## **History of Significant BoD Decisions & Activities**

## **MG-1978-05** (MISGAGRAM-1978-May)

On September 23, over 200 Seniors from 27 Maryland Country Clubs took part in the second annual Fall Championship Tournament. We salute the winners - Manor CC succeeded Eaglehead CC as MISGA's club champions with a 260 net score by its four 2-Man Teams, just nosing out Lakewood by one stroke. Names of the winners are listed on the 1977 2-Man Team Champions list.

#### MG-1979-04

Chartwell was the 1978 MISGA 2-Man Team Champion. Prince Georges and Washingtonian tied for 2nd place in the team championship and Montgomery Village was 4th. Names of the winners are listed on the on the 1978 2-Man Team Champions list.

MISGA's fourth annual 2-Man Team Championship will be held on September 28, 1979 at Kenwood and Montgomery Country Clubs. The golf format will be as in the past - each club will nominate two 2-Man Teams, one to play at Kenwood and the other at Montgomery Village. Each team will play two-man best ball and the lowest combined net score of the two teams will determine the 1979 MISGA Champion Club.

#### MG-1980-05

As before, play will be two-man best ball, with each two-man team having a minimum combined handicap of 25. Two teams from each club will qualify for the championship based on combined net scores.

Greencastle set a record 36-hole score of 116 (25 under par) in winning last year (1979) when the championship was played over two courses - Kenwood and Montgomery Village. It beat Tantallon by nine shots. Paul Graybar and John Wheeler teamed-up for a net 56 (14 under) at Kenwood, while John Flaherty and Dick Mehaffey turned-in a 60 (11 under) at Montgomery Village.

#### MG-1980-12

Sparrows Point won the championship on a match-of-cards with Kenwood -- Max Bost & Harry Ockershausen and Lou Semia & Farold Norris. Names of the winners are listed on the 1980 2-Man Team Champions list.

#### MG-1981-05

Slots for the 2-Man Teams for the Fall Championship qualifying round will be allocated to clubs in proportion to their membership with two provisos: each club is guaranteed a minimum of one team and selection of qualifiers will be based on the results of each of the three clubs as qualifying sites - not among the three clubs. This decision was based on eliminating differences in course difficulty and weather conditions. It was further agreed that if not all qualifiers from any site show-up, additional qualifiers would be selected by going down the list (of the best net scores) for the site to select "standby" teams.

#### MG-1982-11

This year, for the first time, each of MISGA's four divisions held its own qualifying tournament. The 1982 annual MISGA Championship Tournament was held on Friday, September 24 at Talbot Country Club in Easton. A full-field of 72 two-man teams competed in four handicap-based flights. Flight "A" - 24 or less, Flight "B" - 25-36, Flight "C" - 37-48 & Flight "D" - over 48.

#### MG-1984-11

The annual MISGA 2-Man Team Championship Tournament discontinued the A-B-C-D flights format for the tournament. Instead, prizes were awarded in accordance to the net score ranking of each 2-Man Team. Twenty-two teams were awarded prizes.

#### MG-1990-09

An anonymous donor has offered MISGA a \$5,000 gift to be used to support a yearly tournament using gross scores in Classes A,B, C & D. Our Club Reps, in their meeting at Chester River Yacht & Country Club on April 23, approved acceptance of the gift after explanations were offered regarding its use. The interest will be used each year to supply the certificate prizes with different awards being named for the Past Presidents of MISGA. The tournament will begin in 1991, allowing for accumulating the money to be used for the prizes. Each division will run qualifying tournaments.

#### Year 1991

The first annual MISGA Presidents Tournament was held August 23, 1991 at Sussex Pines CC in Georgetown, DE. Competitors were divided into four flights of A-B-C-D handicapped players - lowest in "A" to highest in "D".

#### MG-1993-11

The MISGA "Presidents Tournament" was renamed the "Past Presidents Tournament."

#### Year 1993

Both the overall Low Gross and Low Net winners of the Past Presidents Championship Tournament were awarded special recognition with the establishment and presentation of a traveling silver Past Presidents Championship Bowl. The year, name and home club of each champion is engraved on each champion's bowl. The home club of the champion will retain possession of the Bowl until the following year tournament. After engraving, the Bowls will be transported to the home clubs of the new champions.

#### MG-1997-02

Tournament Committee Chairman, George Lipscomb, reported for his Ad Hoc Committee: (a) The present tie breaking procedure shall be used (sum of the last 9 holes, last 6 holes, last 3 holes and the last hole) and (b) Weather interrupted tournaments - a minimum of nines holes that are in common to each player in that flight must be played to determine winners. If there is no rain date, prize money must be returned to each player.

#### MG-1997-11

Tournaments Chairman, George Lipscomb, requested that the Tournament Chairman or Host Club Rep prepare short narratives on tournament results together with appropriate pictures.

#### MG-1998-11

2-Man Team Tournament concerns: Three years ago a complaint was made to the MISGA President that the same 30+ handicappers were repeat winners each year in the 2-Man Team Championship Tournaments.

A comparison was made of the tournament results for 1995 and the previous year. The comparison indicated that there were only two repeat winners with 30+ handicaps; whereas, there were five repeat winners from the lower handicap winners.

Recently, a complaint was made to the MISGA President that single-digit handicappers had little or no chance of winning any prize money in this tournament.

The results of this year's MISGA tournament and the division qualifying tournaments plus the 1995 MISGA State Tournament were reviewed. Based on this review, it was found that 9.5% of those participating were single-digit handicappers and that on the average they won 10% of the prize money. This indicates that single-digit handicappers are winning their fair share of the prize money in these tournaments.

#### MG-1999-11

A motion was passed by the Board of Directors to invite Past Presidents to participate in the ABCD State Tournament. They will not have to qualify. They will be integrated into a flight according to their handicap.

To commemorate their victory, the Grand Champions of the 2-Man Team Championship Tournament were awarded an engraved 10" diameter pewter tray. The 2nd place finishers were awarded an engraved 8" diameter tray.

#### Year 2001

In addition to their names engraved on the Low Gross and Low Net traveling silver **Past Presidents Champion Bowls**, each champion was presented with an engraved pewter tankard.

#### Year 2009

For both the *Past Presidents* and 2-Man Team Championship Tournaments, the official "tee marker placement" was relocated from the **middle tee** marker to the **forward tee** markers. The **forward tee** marker placement was deemed more appropriate for senior golfers.

For the first time, the Low Gross champions of the 2-Man Team Championship Tournament were awarded trophies and prizes.

#### Year 2010

At the September 14, 2010 MISGA Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to retire the two traveling, silver *Past Presidents Champion Bowls* honoring the *Grand Gross* and *Grand Net* Tournament Champions. Many of the names of previous champions are worn thin and unreadable. Currently, high quality individual trophies are presented to each champion. The burdensome logistics of retrieving and delivering the bowls plus the cost of engraving and mailing the bowls made retirement the more practical option.

In the future, the **Grand Gross** and **Grand Net Champions** of both the *Past Presidents* and *2-Man Team* Championship Tournaments will receive high quality individual trophies only. All other winners will receive host club gift certificates.

At the December 7, 2010 Board of Directors meeting, the Board approved, for official use, the updated and revised MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines. The approved MCT Guidelines converted the "narrative textbook" format into a more user friendly "outline" format.

The MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines were supplemented to include the USGA rules governing women competing with men - tee marker placements and handicap allocations.

At the September 13, 2001 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to permit the previous year's **Gross** and **Net Grand Champions** (Past Presidents and 2-Man Team) to compete in the current year's Championship Tournaments without having to qualify. However, they will be required to pay the entry fee.

The **Score vs**. **Par** procedure for determining winners and awarding prizes at a MCT that has been suspended because of unforeseen circumstances without the possibility of resumption of play was approved at the September 13, 2011 Board of Directors meeting. A tutorial for applying the procedure was developed and posted on the MISGA website.

At the December 6, 2011 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to reduce the size of the fields for the **Past Presidents** Tournament from 128 competitors to 100 and the **2-Man Team** from 64 teams to 50. Hopefully, this will result in a reduction in the tournament playing time.

The MCT tie breaking procedure was modified to require a sudden-death playoff for both the **Gross** and **Net Grand Champions** and optional application of either the match-of-cards or the PGA tie breaking procedures for all other winners.

#### Year 2012

The reduction in the size of the playing fields for the two MCTs (Past Presidents - 100 participants and 2-Man Team - 50 teams) resulted in a reduction of approximately 30 minutes in playing time.

At the September 11, 2012 Board of Directors Meeting voted to:

- 1. Allow the MISGA Tournament Chairman (MTC) to select the highest quality available clubs within a reasonable driving distance from the Chesapeake Bay Bridge as hosts for the two MISGA Championship Tournaments (Past Presidents and 2-Man Team).
- 2. Permit an equal 50-50% split of the prize pool for both the **Gross** and **Net** 2-Man Team Championship Tournament winners.
- 3. Allow an appeal process for the "no substitute" rule as it applies to the 2-Man Team Championship Tournament.

At the March 13, 2013 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to approve to:

- 1. Assess a handicap penalty on individuals and 2-man teams who have won the **Net Grand Champion** title in two successive MCTs. They will incur a 20% reduction in their course handicap the following year and an addition 10% for each successive year winning (3 successive years = 30% reduction, 4 successive years = 40% reduction, etc.).
- 2. Award the **Gross** and **Net Grand Champions** of both MCTs a Pro Shop Gift Certificate. Previously, they were only awarded a trophy.

At the December 2, 2013 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board unanimously endorsed the MISGA Tournaments Chairman's proposition that the two MCTs should continue as high class, regal golfing championships with enhanced amenities and their prominence should not be downsized.

#### Year 2014

The Guidebook for Conducting a MISGA Championship Tournament was developed and posted on the MISGA website. It contains detailed information and guidance for those who have the responsibility for managing and directing the operations of the two MCTs and Division Qualifiers.

At the Dec. 2, 2014 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to approve the recommendation that the MISGA Treasury subsidize the "prize pools" of the two MCTs. On a per annum basis, the Past Presidents (ABCD) Tournament will receive \$640 and the 2-Man Team Tournament will receive \$720 from the MISGA Treasury. This is in addition to the annual \$150 subsidy to the PP-ABCD tournament (from the \$5,000 gift to MISGA by former MISGA President Merle Shumaker).

#### Year 2015

As a result of the Board of Directors 2014 decision to subsidize the "prize pools" of the two MCTs, each of the Grand Champions was presented with a \$100 pro shop gift certificate. This is an all-time high payout for the MCTs.

At the Feb. 24, 2016 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to continue the MISGA Treasury's financial support for the two MCTs (prize pool subsidies). This includes the trophies and pro shop gift certificates. As a result of the Board's retention vote, the payouts will remain the same for the 2016 MCTs as they were in 2015.

At the Sept. 13, 2016 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board approved the recommendation that the Special Event Contest winners (Closest-to-the-Pin and Closest-to-the-Line) will receive either a box of golf balls (12-pack) **OR** an equal share of cash from an established entry fee prize pool.

At the Dec. 7, 2016 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board directed the MCT Tournament Committee to apply Section 3-3 and Section 10 of the USGA Handicap System manual to determine an associate's MCT Course Handicap when there is creditable evidence (extraordinary and exceptional performances at MCTs) to indicate his MCT Course Handicap is inaccurate (higher than his playing ability). This action is a result of a special committee's findings that a MISGA member had been crowned Net Grand Champion 5 times and finished first or second 7 times in 14 MCTs during a seven-year period.

#### Year 2017

No Board action involving MISGA's two championship tournaments.

#### Year 2018

No Board action involving MISGA's two championship tournaments.

#### Year 2019

At the Feb. 6, 2019 Board of Directors Meeting, the Division 2 Board members requested revision of the MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines to:

1. Section III, B, 3 - Allow associates from different MISGA clubs to be teammates in the 2-Man Team Tournament. The Board decided that exceptions to the established guideline may be granted upon formal application (because of

special or emergency situations such as illness, injury, death, etc.) to the host club MISGA Tournament Committee.

2. Section IV, A - Allow associates to play from the front tee. This request has been made and discussed at previous Board meetings. For a number and variety of cited reasons, the Board rejected this request.

At the Sept. 10, 2019 Board of Directors Meeting, Tournament Chairman Greg Morris and Tournament Coordinator Jake Jacobi reported that while the Net Grand Champion was redeeming his monetary winnings in the Norbeck CC Pro Shop, his trophy had disappeared from its resting place on his dining table. It has never been found. Hence, both recommended that a replacement trophy be procured and presented to the Net Grand Champion. The recommendation was approved by the Board of Directors.

#### Year 2020 (The year of the Covid-19 pandemic)

At the Feb. 13, 2020 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board decided that MISGA must update its publication MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines. This action is required as result of the USGA's implementation of significant changes to its USGA Rules of Handicapping manual. To accomplish the mission, the Board established a special committee with the task of up-dating the MCT Guidelines. The committee included: Jeff Hild (MISGA President), Greg Morris (MISGA Tournament Chair), Wayne Rowland (MISGA Vice President & Rules & Handicap Chair), Jake Jacobi (MISGA Webmaster & DTC-4), Lloyd Stimson (MISGA History Chair & past MTC) and Don Hoffmeyer (DTC-2).

On Feb. 25, 2020, the Board's special committee to update the MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines for compliance with the 2020 USGA Rules for Handicapping met at Norbeck Country Club. Their task was accomplished. The MCT Guidelines have been updated and posted on the MISGA website.

At the April 8, 2020 Board of Directors Teleconference, Tournament Chair Greg Morris stated that the *PP-ABCD*, to be held July 20 at Holly Hills, and the *2-Man Team*, to be held September 10 at Norbeck, are still on, but the pandemic will

determine whether or not they will be cancelled. The Board agreed to remain with the status quo.

At the May 12, 2020 Board of Directors Teleconference, as a result of the surging pandemic, the Board voted, unanimously, to cancel both of MISGA's 2020 Championship Tournaments.

At the Sept. 21, 2020 Board of Directors Teleconference, Tournament Chair Greg Morris proposed that the 2021 Championship Tournaments be held late in the golfing season. Norbeck CC and Holly Hills CC are the projected host clubs. By unanimous vote, the Board agreed to the proposal.

#### Year 2021

No Board action involving MISGA's two championship tournaments.

#### Year 2022

No Board action involving MISGA's two championship tournaments.

#### Year 2023

At the June 19, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to continue to allow all participants who wish to compete for the <u>Gross Grand Champion</u> title and trophy to select and play from the "A" flight tee placement boxes. They will be eligible to compete for all prizes in the "A" flight. They will be ineligible to compete for prizes in any other flight.

At the June 19, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting, the Board voted to increase the MISGA subsidy payments to both the 2 Player Team and Past Presidents (ABCD) to \$1,000 each.
