

## TIDBITS OF MISGA HISTORY

**MISGA ASSOCIATES DUES** - Article III, C of the MISGA Constitution stipulates that continued membership of Clubs and Associates is contingent upon payment of such fees, dues and other charges as may, at any time, be established by the Board of Directors.

In the beginning, the Board set the MISGA Associates dues payment at \$2.50.

1994 - The annual dues payment was raised to \$4.00.

2006 - At the Board of Directors meeting held on December 9, 2004 at the Elks Club, Salisbury, MD it was moved, seconded and unanimously passed that the annual Associate dues payment be increased to \$10.00 effective January, 2006. No reason for the increase was provided.

2010 - The annual dues payment was reduced to \$5.00. This decrease was a result of the Board's decision, at the December 8, 2009 Board of Directors Meeting held at Patuxent Greens Golf Club in Laurel, MD, to terminate publication and distribution of a hardcopy MISGAgram. The Board voted to switch to an electronic copy posted on the MISGA website. The electronic copy eliminated the need to hire an IT contractor to develop, maintain & code (by division & club) a roster of Associates (with their name & address) as well as the printing and postage costs.

2019 - At the Board of Directors meeting held on December 13, 2018 at Chartwell Country Club in Severna Park, MD, the Board voted to increase the annual dues payment to \$10.00. This increase was to halt a progressive financial deficit to the MISGA treasury. In addition, it allowed continuation of subsidies for division "operating expenses" and the two MISGA Championship Tournaments.

### 2019 - MISGA PAST PRESIDENTS (ABCD) CHAMPIONSHIP

## NORBECK COUNTRY CLUB - THURSDAY - AUGUST 8, 2019

ROCKVILLE, MD (Rain Date: Wednesday-September 18, 2019)

FORMAT: 18-HOLE - INDIVIDUAL STROKE PLAY (Gross & Net)

A maximum field of 100 competitors will be divided into four flights of A-B-C-D handicapped players – lowest in "A" to highest in "D" (approximately 25% in each flight). "A" players will compete against "A" players, "B" players against "B" players, "C" players against "Cs" and "Ds" against "Ds." The Gross and Net Grand Champions can come from any of the four flights.

ELIGIBILITY: All MISGA associates in good standing. Finalists must qualify through their Division's selection process. Each finalist must have an established valid USDA handicap computed and maintained at the finalist's home club. The current MISGA President, all MISGA Past Presidents and the 2018 Gross and Net Past Presidents (ABCD) Grand Champions are automatically eligible (do not have to compete in their Division's Qualifier), but must pay the Entry Fee.

HANDICAP ALLOWANCE: 100% of course handicap.



#### PRIZES:

- Based on a full field of 100 finalists, 26 winners will receive a Pro Shop Gift Certificate (the Gross and Net Grand Champions plus 3 gross and 3 net winners in each flight).
- 2. In addition, the Gross and Not Grand Champions will receive a high quality engraved trophy.
- 3. Winners of the four Closest-to-the-Pin holes will receive a 12 box of golf balls.

ENTRY FEE: \$110 per person - includes a barbeque lunch, range balls, cart fee, cash bar cocktail hour (w/light hors d'oeuvers), awards banquet (plated-double entrée - surf & turf) and prize pool.

#### FORMAT: 18-HOLE - TEAM STROKE PLAY (Gross & Net Best Ball)

The maximum field of 50 teams will <u>not</u> be divided into flights. Each 2-Man Team will be competing against all other 2-Man Teams. There will be one **Gross** and one Not 2-Man Team **Grand Champion**.

ELIGIBILITY: All MISGA associates in good standing. Finalists must qualify through their Division's selection process - normally a Division Qualifier. Finalists must have an established valid USGA handicap computed and maintained at the finalist's home club. Teammates of each 2-Man Team must be members of the same club. The 2018 Gross & Net Grand Champions are automatically eligible (do not have to compete in their Division's Qualifier), but must pay the Entry Fee.

#### HANDICAP ALLOWANCE:

- 1. 90% of each partner's course handicap. 95% for women
- There will be an additional 10% reduction to each partner's course handicap if the partners' course handicaps differ by more than 8 strokes.

#### PRIZES:

- Based on a full field of 50 teams, 14 total teams will receive a Pro Shop Gift Certificate (the Gross and Net Grand Champions plus 6 gross teams and 6 net teams).
- 2. In addition, the Gross and Not Grand Champions will receive a high quality engraved trophy.
- 3. Winners of the four Closest-to-the-Pin holes will receive a cash prize split the pot. \$5 entry fee.

ENTRY FEE: \$110 per person - includes a light lunch (cold cuts sandwich bar), range balls, cart fee, cash bar cocktail hour (w/light hors d'oeuvers), awards banquet (plated - surf & turf) and prize pool.
