Usually spring is the time of the year most of us eagerly await to begin our golf travails for the new year. Each of us eager to drive, chip, and putt better than ever before based on the winter self-analysis of our golf game. Unfortunately, 2020 has welcomed us with several dangerous problems.

Along with a worse than normal flu season highlighted by a strain for which there was no early vaccine, we are faced with the insidious corona disease (COVID-19). Most distressing is that persons 60+ years of age are most susceptible to the disease for both infections and fatalities.

Please make sure you keep your members and visiting clubs informed of any actions you take.



SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO UPDATE THE MISGA CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES

In January 2020, the USGA implemented new rules for golf handicapping. The new rules are far reaching and have a significant impact on MISGA golfing events as well as the MISGA Championship Tournament Guidelines. These Guidelines provide the instructions for managing and conducting the Past Presidents (ABCD) and 2-Man Team MISGA-wide championship tournaments.

The MISGA Board of Directors established a special committee to update and modify the Guidelines to comply with the USGA's Rules of Handicapping. On Tuesday, February 25, 2020, the Committee met at Norbeck Country Club to undertake its assigned objective. Mission accomplished!!

WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM

On January 1, 2020 the World Handicap System (WHS) became effective. This brings a single set of Rules of Handicapping and Course Rating System for all National Golf Associations worldwide. It is administered by the USGA and the R&A. Previously there were six different handicapping authorities and they did not all compute handicaps or course ratings the same.

Previously the USGA computed your handicap based on the Course Rating of the tee you played. You could have the same handicap for different tees on the same course. Because of this adjustment had to be made if players played from different set of tees within the same tournament. Par played no part in the handicap computation. Now par plays a significant role in your handicap index.

You will have a separate course handicap for all tees at a given course, which will represent the number of strokes needed to play to Par. Which means that players can play from different tees without any adjustment if Par is the same for all tees.

Below are just a few of the changes that will affect MISGA members:

All players will have a home course that will keep their Handicap Index. They **must** list all courses that they belong to or play out of and advise their home course.

The Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) has been replaced with Maximum Hole Score, which is Net Double Bogey (Par + 2 + any handicap strokes).

Exceptional Tournament Scores no longer exists. It has been replaced with Exceptional Score Reduction for any round posted. Any Score Differential of 7.0 strokes or greater will be subject to an Exceptional Score Reduction.

Rounds are now either General Play or Competition. Tournament designation no longer exists since it was hard to define what was a Tournament Round.

Handicap Index is updated every day if a round was posted the previous day, which eliminates the need for a Trending Handicap Index.


You will have a Low Handicap Index which represents demonstrated ability over 365-day period from the most recent score in their scoring record. For MISGA members this was your Handicap Index as of January 1, 2020. It will change each time your Handicap Index is lower than what is currently posted.

There is a "Cap" on how high your Handicap Index can increase in a 365-day period. The maximum a Handicap Index can increase in any 365-day period is 5.0 Your Low Handicap Index determines when the "Cap" takes effect. There is no limit on how low your Handicap Index can go.

Tidbits of MISGA History

THE MISGA WEBSITE

Beginning - At the September 19, 2000, Board of Directors meeting, Secretary Dick Walsh (*West Winds*) announced that he had created a MISGA web page. He informed the Board that the web page contains the MISGA leadership roster, driving directions to all of MISGA's member clubs, the "minutes" to board meetings and links to individual club websites.

Website Committee - At the February 12, 2003, Board of Directors meeting, President Ken Wallgren (*Hobbit's Glen*) proposed the establishment of a formal *Web Committee*. The committee would be responsible for the design, management and maintenance of a *MISGA*

Website. The website will provide relevant and useful information and data to MISGA officials and associates. Members of the committee included: Webmaster - Dick Walsh, Assistant Webmaster - Byron Keadle (news liaison - Patuxent Green); Assistant Webmaster - Tom Tarpley (business liaison - Holly Hills). Dick Walsh was assigned the responsibility for developing a listing of the committee's duties and responsibilities for inclusion in Section VI of the MISGA Bylaws. A motion was made and unanimously approved by the Board.

Operating Instructions - At the Dec. 1, 2006 Board of Directors meeting, the Board directed that responsible MISGA officials submit to the *Webmaster*, no later than March 1, all additions, deletions and changes to their MISGA Leadership Roster (*Division Directors, Assistant Division Directors, Club Reps, Assistant Club Reps, Club Pros, etc.*). Information to be submitted includes: title, name, mailing address, e-mail address and telephone number.

Today – The MISGA Website has grown into one helluva source of MISGA information. It is the primary station for all there is to know about MISGA - e.g., general info (mission & objectives), organizational rulebooks (Constitution, Bylaws & Club Reps Guidelines), organizational structure (MISGA, divisions & clubs), leadership rosters (at MISGA, division & club levels), schedules of meetings & events, division & club webpages, tutorials & guidebooks for MISGA's administrative activities, forms for reports and finances, associates dues reports, MISGAgrams, flyers for tournaments and special outings (frolics & flings), "minutes" to board meetings, roster of past presidents, historical roster of board members (1976-present), history of board actions (annual & cumulative), history of the Green Jacket Award, hole-in-one honor roll, links to photos, MISGA-liany, etc.
