President's Message



2020 has been a challenging year for all. For MISGA the decision was made early to cancel the season and start fresh for 2021. The MISGA Board decided not to collect club dues and thus forgo collecting member dues. Those club who sent in club dues in 2020 will automatically be paid in 2021. On September 21, 2020, the MISGA Board voted unanimously to allow mixers in 2021, which raises several questions that need to be addressed.

- 1. How many clubs will be participating in 2021?
- a. Do those clubs wishing not to participate still wish to be a member of MISGA?
- 2. How will clubs address any social restrictions due to COVID-19.

It will be up to the Division Directors to ascertain how many clubs in their division will continue in 2021.

Since each local jurisdiction can set their own guidance on when and how restrictions for COVID-19 apply it will be up to each club to abide by those restrictions and advise all participants. Clubs may find it necessary to find new or different formats to accommodate smaller size mixers. One format that MCC is exploring is the college team format. Basically, each team is a predetermined size (example 10 player team). Invite appropriate number of clubs to achieve your player limit (we use 6 clubs for sixty players, which can accommodate individual carts if necessary). We use best 2 gross and 3 net scores for combined team score. We pay first and second place (first place 60%, second place 40%). This exceeds the 25% payout to the field and gives each player on the team either \$60 or \$40 to spend in the pro shop. An argument is this restricts the number of players a club may bring, but under the current restrictions that is already a reality.

WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM AND HOW IT APPLIES TO MISGA

There are two types of handicaps:

- 1. Course Handicap you will have a Course Handicap for every set of tees that has a course and slope rating. This will be the handicap you use on your home course for most rounds you play. You will have a target score you should shoot each round and it is par plus your handicap. You cannot play a set of tees for handicap purposes that has not been rated by the USGA. (Look in USGA Course Rating and Slope Database).
- 2. Playing Handicap Course Handicap minus handicap allowance (i.e. 85%) minus difference in par. Appendix C in the Rules of Handicapping gives the recommended allowances for various formats. Most MISGA mixers are best 2 out of 4 format which has a handicap allowance of 85%.

Maximum score that may be posted for a round is Net Double Bogey (if course handicap is calculated greater than 54 and a player gets 4 or more strokes on a hole, the maximum score is par + 5 for handicap purposes). **This will also be the Maximum Score for all MISGA mixers**. Net Double Bogey is computed as follows:

Par + 2 strokes + any handicap strokes player receives on the hole. (The handicap used for this computation is Course Handicap not Playing Handicap).

It is the players responsibility to know what their handicap is for the set of tees they are playing on a given course. MSGA App has a course handicap calculator that you can use to get your handicap for any course and tee.

At MISGA mixers the dots on the cards will be the Playing Handicap.



The above sample shows the Course Handicap (13)/Playing Handicap (11). For the competition the player gets 11 strokes. For Maximum Score Net Double Bogey, the player gets an additional two strokes for posting purposes (a stroke on holes 4 and 12). It is recommended by the Rules of Handicapping that a player post scores hole-by-hole. The MSGA system and its App defaults to hole-by-hole.

There are two types of rounds: General Play and Competition Play. General Play is a casual round or competitive round not organized by a Committee (MISGA, local golf association, etc.).

Competition Play is any round organized by a committee.

Maximum Index for all players is 54.0 – All MISGA Championships will cap handicap index to 36.0 for all players. Any player can play in the MISGA Championship regardless of their handicap index if they qualify with their respective division. Any player who qualifies whose handicap index is greater than 36.0 will be reduced to 36.0.

Holes not finished by a player, they must enter a score of either *most likely score* or Net Double Bogey whichever is lower. The Rules of Handicapping now has guidelines for *most likely score*.

Position of Ball	Strokes to be added	
If the ball lies on the putting green and is no more than 5 feet from the hole:	Add one additional stroke.	
If the ball lies between 5 feet and 20 yards from the hole:	Add 2 or 3 additional strokes, depending on the position of the ball, the difficulty of the green and the ability of the player.	
If the ball lies more than 20 yards from the hole:	Add 3 or 4 additional strokes, depending on the position of the ball, the difficulty of the green and the ability of the player.	

Should a player not play a hole they must post Net Par for that hole.

Posting of scores is paramount. Scores should be posted by midnight of the day of play.


Each player has a *home club* designated by the player to ensure their Handicap Index is managed in accordance with the Rules of Handicapping. A player may belong to more than one club and must tell his *home club* what those clubs are, so that they may be listed in club memberships in the regional association system (MSGA). A player should advise any clubs they belong to which club is their *home club* and will be maintaining their handicap.

Most MISGA members in Maryland use GolfNet (MSGA) handicap system and your page when posting should look something like this. It lists your MSGA number and your *home club*.



On the mobile app these maybe stacked vertically.

To find which courses a player has membership at you need to look for Community on the webpage. On the computer that is on the left side of the page. On the mobile app click on the arrow in the upper left corner under the MSGA Emblem.



It will list all clubs that a player belongs with the home club listed first.

All members of MISGA who play from multiple courses need to have all courses listed under memberships.
