It has a simple answer! Use Sun Screen



Tidbits of MISGA History

MISGA Mixers

Since its inception in 1976, MISGA's most important activity, and one which sets it apart from most other golf associations, is its sponsorship of hundreds of inter-club mixers each year. They provide members with an opportunity to play other courses throughout Maryland and Delaware. At a mixer, senior golfers from a member club host their counterparts from other member clubs. Dates are normally scheduled six to nine months in advance by the club representatives with final coordination between the clubs several days before the event. The host club rep, with assistance from the pro shop staff, arranges foursomes with members from each participating club. Based on each player's handicap, teams will be established with an "A", "B", "C" and "D" handicap level player. Competition is not between clubs but between a "mixed" foursome against the rest of the field. To complete the "mix", a guest and a host usually share a cart.

The format of play is determined by the host club rep – e.g., two best balls, modified Stableford, Hastings Hybrid, A-C + B-D, Scramble, etc. A shotgun start ensures the opportunity for the players to enjoy pre-golf coffee & donuts, a post-golf luncheon with the awarding of Pro Shop gift certificates. Guests do not pay green fees, but all players do pay for cart rentals, dining and \$5 for the prize pool. In addition, mixers may include a separate cash entry fee for "50/50" and "Closest-to-the-Pin" contests. At a later date in the season, the role of the host and guest clubs are reversed.

It is worth emphasizing that mixers are not competitions between clubs or typical matches, but opportunities to meet and form friendships with other senior MISGA golfers.
