President's Message



The December MISGA Board meeting was held at Crofton Country Club where I was elected to serve as the 42nd MISGA President. There have only been two people who have served for more than one term. At the very beginning of recorded history, Al Hagen, from Lakewood, served as President for the first five years of MISGA. The only other repeat President was Ralph Starkey who presided in 2007 and 2012. I am humbled while reading the names of the 41 guys who have preceded me. I will do my best to be part of this august group.

I believe MISGA is still going through a transitionary year beginning with the 2020 COVID-19 shut-down year. The MISGA Board wisely decided to suspend all MISGA outings due to the strong advice to avoid crowds, etc.

The "restart" year of 2021 brought forth new challenges to MISGA. Some of our member clubs got hooked on the extra revenue received from selling nearly all available tee times at list that they could not see their way to offer MISGA Seniors with pricing they had agreed to in prior years. The document each club signed when joining MISGA proscribes pricing should be based on cart fees - waiving green fees, lunch and prize money. Several venues succumbed to "COVID Greed Syndrome" (CGS) where they made a conscious decision that they didn't need the MISGA Mixers at discounted prices when they could continue to sell most tee times at list. They seem to have forgotten the years of MISGA Mixers bringing 75 – 100 golfers to a slow mid-week day. (Continued on p 3)



Tidbits of MISGA History

MISGA Board Bash

In the early 1980s, the MISGA Board of Directors established a Board Bash. The Bash was a special 2-day golf outing created to recognize and thank all the Club Reps and their assistants for their hard work and efforts in performing their volunteer duties and responsibilities. The Board cited them as the ones who had been key to making MISGA function successfully. The event included two days of golf with a delightful banquet and the awarding of prizes and presents. Wives, girlfriends or guests were invited.

Traditionally, the *Board Bash* has been held in early September at either the Penn National Golf Club & Resort located in Fayetteville, PA or the Carroll Valley Golf Course at the Liberty Mountain Resort in Fairfield, PA. Lodging at the facility is included.

In 2005, the name was changed to the Summer Frolic and was opened to all MISGA associates. However, in recent years participation has been in a steady decline. This parallels the decline in the number of MISGA member clubs and associates. Because of this decline, 2020 MISGA President Jeff Hild, who also served as the Frolic Director, was forced to suspend the event for 2020. Of course, the Covid19 pandemic would have cancelled it anyway. Hild stated that, in the future, MISGA will be looking for an alternative to the Summer Frolic.
