

President's Message








President's Message, continued

SAMUEL L. HALL



One of MISGA's most industrious and prodigious members - Sam Hall - passed away at his home in Locust Grove, VA on January 5, 2022. He fought a long battle with kidney cancer.

Sam spent many years as a member of and in leadership roles of MISGA. He assumed the MISGA

Club Rep position at Tantallon CC (now National GC) in 1994 and remained at the helm through mid-1996. From 1999-2002, he served as the Division 6 Director (then Div. 3). In 2001, Sam served as MISGA Vice President and became MISGA President in 2002. In 1999, he established the current MISGA Rules & Handicap Committee and served as the chairman from 2000-2002. In 2001, he authored the *MISGA Rules & Handicap Manual (open link below)*. His tenure with MISGA ended when he and his wife moved from Fort Washington, MD to Locust Grove, VA in 2004.

Sam was born in York, Nebraska on February 23, 1938. He graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1960. Upon graduation, he received a commission from the USAF where he served until his retirement in 1986. He attained the rank of Colonel. After retirement he was a defense business consultant. In 1961, while he was attending flight school in Dallas, TX he met his wife, Joan. They were married in 1962. She passed away in 2011. Sam is survived by his son, daughter, 6 grandchildren and his companion Gertraud Yeager. In the future, Sam and Joan's ashes will be interned together at the Omaha National Cemetery in Nebraska.

Tidbits of MISGA History MISGA ICONS - Clarence J. Myers (L) & Dr. Thomas Tarpley (R)



Since its establishment in 1976, MISGA has had many fine and illustrious gentlemen volunteer and serve the organization in many capacities. For MISGA to function effectively and capably it requires much time and effort by these volunteers. Two noblemen who have volunteered and served MISGA in many dimensions over many years are Dr. Thomas Tarpley of Holly Hills CC and Clarence J. Myers of Manor CC.

Tom Tarpley entered the realm of MISGA in 1988 when he became the Assistant Club Rep at Eaglehead CC *(later named changed to WestWinds)*

and then served as the Club Rep from 1991-1993. Later he moved to Holly Hills CC where he was the MISGA Club Rep during the years 1996-1997 and again 2012-2013. From 1997-2000, as the Director of Division II, he served on MISGA's Board of Directors. Tom was the MISGA Treasurer 2001-2004. His second term on the Board was from 2004–2007. During that term, Tarpley served as the MISGA Vice President in 2005 and President in 2006. During 2009, Tom served as the Tournament Chairman. From 2000-2002, Tarpley served as the chairman of the PP Ad Hoc Committee and again from 2010-present. He served his third Board term as Director of Division II from 2011-2013.

C. J. Myers' responsibilities in MISGA began as Club Rep at Manor CC in 1994–1996. He served as Director of Division IV from 1995-1999. During that term, C.J. served as the MISGA Vice President in 1996 and President in 1997. From 2000-2002, he was Chairman of the Policy & Planning Committee. In 2003, C.J. chaired the Rules & Handicap Committee. From 2004-2008 he served as MISGA's Tournament Chairman. Once again, during 2016–2018 he served as Club Rep for Manor CC. In 2018, Myers served a second term as Director of Division IV. For many years, C.J. has directed the annual Division IV Holiday Luncheon and awards ceremony at Manor Country Club.

The *Sam Hasting's Green Jacket* is awarded to MISGA volunteers who have provided many years of outstanding service *(beyond the call of duty)* and contributed much time and effort for the furtherance and enhancement of the MISGA organization. C.J. Myers was awarded the *Green Jacket* in 2005 and Tom Tarpley was awarded the *Green Jacket* in 2007.

Over the years, Tom and C.J. have become well known for hosting evening *Bull Sessions* during the annual Board Bash/Summer Frolic. Normally, the sessions are held on the patio outside their shared hotel room. However, it's inside if the weather dictates. A variety of grand liquid refreshments supplemented with very tasty hors d'oeuvers complement the majestic "discussions of life". C.J.'s electronics equipment provides the soft sounds of gentle music. To participate in their *Bull Sessions* is an honored experience.
