


Well done guys and the moral of the story is... don't bet with these guys at your next MISGA! Also, kudos and thanks to Crofton and Holly Hills for a job well done.



MISGA CLUB & ASSOCIATES MEMBERSHIP

As a seniors golfing organization, MISGA began operations in 1976. During that first year, there were a total of 12 member golf clubs with 240 associates. Since that initial year, club membership peaked in 2011 with 68 member clubs. Associates membership peaked in 2000 with 4,760 associates.

This year, MISGA club membership is at 35. At the end of 2022, the total number of MISGA associates was 1,729. The associates total for 2023 has not yet been tabulated.
