CLARENCE J. "CJ" MYERS

One of MISGA's longest serving, most industrious and prodigious members - "CJ" Myers passed away at his home in Olney, MD on November 4, 2023. "CJ" was born in Butte, Montana on August 25, 1932.

"CJ's" responsibilities in MISGA began as Club Rep at Manor Country Club in 1994-1996. He served as Director of Division IV from 1995-1999. During that term, "CJ" served as the MISGA Vice President in 1996 and MISGA President in 1997. From 2000 -2002, he was Chairman of the Policy & Planning Committee. In 2003, "CJ" chaired the Rules & Handicap Committee. From 2004-2008, he served as MISGA's Tournament Chairman. Once again, during 2016-2018 he served as Club Rep for Manor CC. In 2018, he served a second term as Director of Division IV. For many years, "CJ" directed the annual Division IV Holiday Luncheon and awards ceremony at Manor Country Club.
