
President's Message

Sadly, as many of you are aware, we are losing two clubs that are not returning to MISGA in 2025: Beaver Creek (Division II) and Hooper's Landing (Division I). This will undoubtedly cause MISGA membership to decline although it is hoped that many will join other local clubs. That said, MISGA membership is down overall albeit that one or two clubs had significant increases in the number of associates registered in 2024. Of course, associates are eligible to obtain membership at as many clubs as they like, so long as they pay their MISGA fees at each. I hear you say, "Why would you join more than one MISGA club?" The most likely explanation is that by doing so one can potentially play at a larger variety of other clubs and participate in more mixers.

Please continue to do all you can to encourage new associates, we would particularly like to see more younger entrants into the MISGA ranks.

One of other the issues that continues to increase is the cost to play in a mixer and as Tom pointed out in last year's December MISGAGRAM, there may not be too much we can do to reduce price but one club that I am aware of, National Golf Club at Tantallon, is trying something new in 2025 as an experiment - golf with prize pool is \$30 and lunch is optional with a range of typical lunch items likely in the \$14 to \$22 range, yet to be finalized. Players will select their choice of lunch or no lunch from the instructions sent to clubs invited to their mixers. We'll check how this goes in 2025.

Other approaches including using different formats rather than the more traditional 2 best net from 4, individual awards, blind draw of teams allowing golfers to choose who they ride with, etc. can be tried to offer value/variety with the aim being to increase participation and potentially encourage players to travel further afield. If you have other ideas, please feel free to send me an e-mail.

You may have heard about the proposal to realign clubs and divisions. Although this has raised considerable debate on the Policy & Planning Committee and at the December 10th Board meeting you should not be alarmed. As it turns out the proposal has been tabled for now and may be revisited by the Policy & Planning Committee if the need arises.

To close, I wish you all a Happy Holiday season and a Happy New Year. Paul Bate

Tie was broken

by a putt-off at dinner won by the Kelly team. Low gross by Michael Mulford with 72, L men's net by Tom Tarpley's 65, and L women's net by Christa Storm's 61!! CTP Helen Mulford and 2nd CTP Charlie Roderick.

ONE MORE THING: Ed Kelly was awarded the crown of MR VIRGINIA BEACH 2024 with a combined 4 round total of -1 net. And Christa Storm was crowned MZ VIRGINIA BEACH with a combined 4 round +5 net
