



In Memory of: Jim Wilcox

Dr. James E. Wilcox, Sr. of <u>Columbia</u>, <u>Maryland</u> passed away peacefully on April 13, 2024.

2024 - MISGA PAST PRESIDENT (ABCD) CHAMPIONSHIP

This year's championship tournament was held on Monday, June 24, 2024, at the very picturesque and highly pleasurable playing course at Crofton Country Club in Crofton, MD. In the early morning, 98 of MISGA's golden age golfers, representing 19 of MISGA's 33 clubs, jumped into their vehicles and traversed the roadways of Maryland to compete for MISGA's Gross and Net Grand Champion prizes.




Crofton's tee boxes, fairways, greens, as well as the roughs, were in excellent playing shape. While it was a bit warm, the gentle (and not so gentle) breezes made it very bearable. At one point Chuck Woods got the anemometer out and measured the breeze...8-9 mph gusting to 20+ mph! Continuous liquidation was preached.

The four ladies and ninety-four gentlemen played from four sets of tee boxes. Scroll down to page 8 for a complete description of each tee box - flight, tee position, par, distance, rating, slope and handicap adjustment. The "first foursome" to complete the course came in at 4 hours and 45 minutes. The "last foursome" was in at 5 hours and 20 minutes.

2024 - MISGA 2-PLAYER TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

HOLLY HILLS COUNTRY CLUB - MONDAY - JULY 29, 2024

IJAMSVILLE, MD (Rain Date: Monday - August 19, 2024)



FORMAT: 18-HOLE - TEAM STROKE PLAY (Gross & Net Best Ball)

The maximum field of 50 teams will not be divided into flights. Each 2-Player Team will be competing against all other 2-Player Teams. There will be one Gross and one Net 2-Player Team Grand Champion.

ELIGIBILITY: All MISGA associates in good standing. Finalists must qualify through their Division's selection process. Finalists must have an established valid USGA Handicap Index computed and maintained at the finalist's home club. Teammates of each 2-Player Team must be members of the same club. The 2023 Gross & Net Grand Champions are automatically eligible (do not have to process through their Division's qualification procedure), but must pay the Entry Fee.

HANDICAP ALLOWANCE:

Tournament Playing Handicap = 85% of Course Handicap (men & women)



PRIZES:

- Based on a full field of 50 teams, 16 total teams (32% of the field) will receive a Pro Shop Gift Certificate (the Gross and Net Grand Champions plus 7 gross teams and 7 net teams).
- In addition, the Gross and Net Grand Champions will receive a high quality engraved trophy.
- 3. Teams desiring to compete for the Gross Grand Champion trophy must play from the SGA Blue tee placement. Inform your Club Rep when you sign-up.
- Winners of the four Closest-to-the-Pin holes will receive a cash prize split the pot. \$5 entry fee.

ENTRY FEE: \$110 per person (\$220 per team) - includes the prize pool, a buffet breakfast, range balls, cart fee, cash bar cocktail hour (w/light hors d'oeuvres) and a buffet dinner.
